Generally, a heavy equipment operator is required to be certified by regional or local agencies. Some are cross-trained and certified to operate a variety of different machine kinds. The employers working in this industry operating heavy machines would usually be trained by taking a formal apprenticeship course or by receiving on-the-job training by their unions or companies. It is necessary that employers hire fully-trained heavy equipment operators in order to adhere to local rules and follow regional and local laws regarding employee safety and job conditions.
