The safety training is essential as well as the communications training that helps the group on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

This means there are plenty of heavy machinery jobs available for the repair and maintenance of the machinery. Operators of heavy machinery are really skilled workers who could repair, diagnose and troubleshoot heavy machinery in a work shop or on site. Sometimes it might be possible for delivery drivers to operate equipment with only a simple CDL. Nevertheless, various jobs would need more particular training.
