Barrie Warehouse Forklift Training Programs - Warehouses could either be industrial, commercial or retail facilities, functioning from product distribution services to bulk product retailing. Regardless of the type of warehouse, workers within warehouse settings should be well trained in safety measures related to material handling and storage, loading docks, conveyor systems, and forklifts and pallet jacks. Good housekeeping is vital to an orderly and safe warehouse environment.

The loading dock system is normally build into the warehouse at a height from the ground making it easy to move products coming in and moving out of the warehouse. Personnel will likewise unload and load merchandise and materials from the elevated docks and ramps. Particular attention must be paid to safety practice throughout this stage. To prevent falls, install yellow striping along the edge of docks and ramps. Pay attention to the area all-around delivery trucks which are parked at the loading dock, specifically the part between dock and the truck. Be certain that truck wheels are chocked while unloading.

In order to distribute products inside the facility, some warehouses use a conveyor system. These systems are made with moving belts and wheels that may pose a pinch point danger. Keep hair and parts of the body well away from conveyors to avoid injury. Elevated conveyors pose a hazard to personnel below if safety nets are absent. Employees have to know how to stop conveyors in the event of emergency. Be aware of the location of emergency stop buttons and off switches. When servicing conveyors, lock out/tag out measures are mandatory.

To be able to make it easier to transport things, forklifts are pallet jacks are most normally used. The operator of the lift truck will require training and certification. Operators of pallet jacks do not need certification, but must be trained on the machine. Training programs instruct operators in the right ways for lifting objects and transporting them to their assigned location. Neither pallet jacks nor forklifts must ever be made use of to transport or lift employees.

To allow for adequate room for machinery and people to pass, storage shelving and rack systems help to create an efficient and orderly work area, especially if they are properly braced. Slow and careful placement of good is required to avoid accidents caused by products falling off the facing aisle. Aisles should be kept clear by storing products flat and in the shelving units. Pallets are used for stacking products. They must be in good condition, and palletted products must be shrink-wrapped or baled, whenever possible.

Personal protective equipment (PPE) must be worn, as appropriate, to protect workers' limbs, heads, hands and feet. Bump caps or hard hats, steel-toed shoes and gloves are common PPE.

Slippery floors pocked with dents and pits present a hazard. Good housekeeping habits include keeping warehouse docks and floors clear of dirt, debris and oil. The area must be kept clear of trash, boxes and baling materials.
